has advised us to follow a healthy lifestyle that depends on a balanced diet and physical exercise.

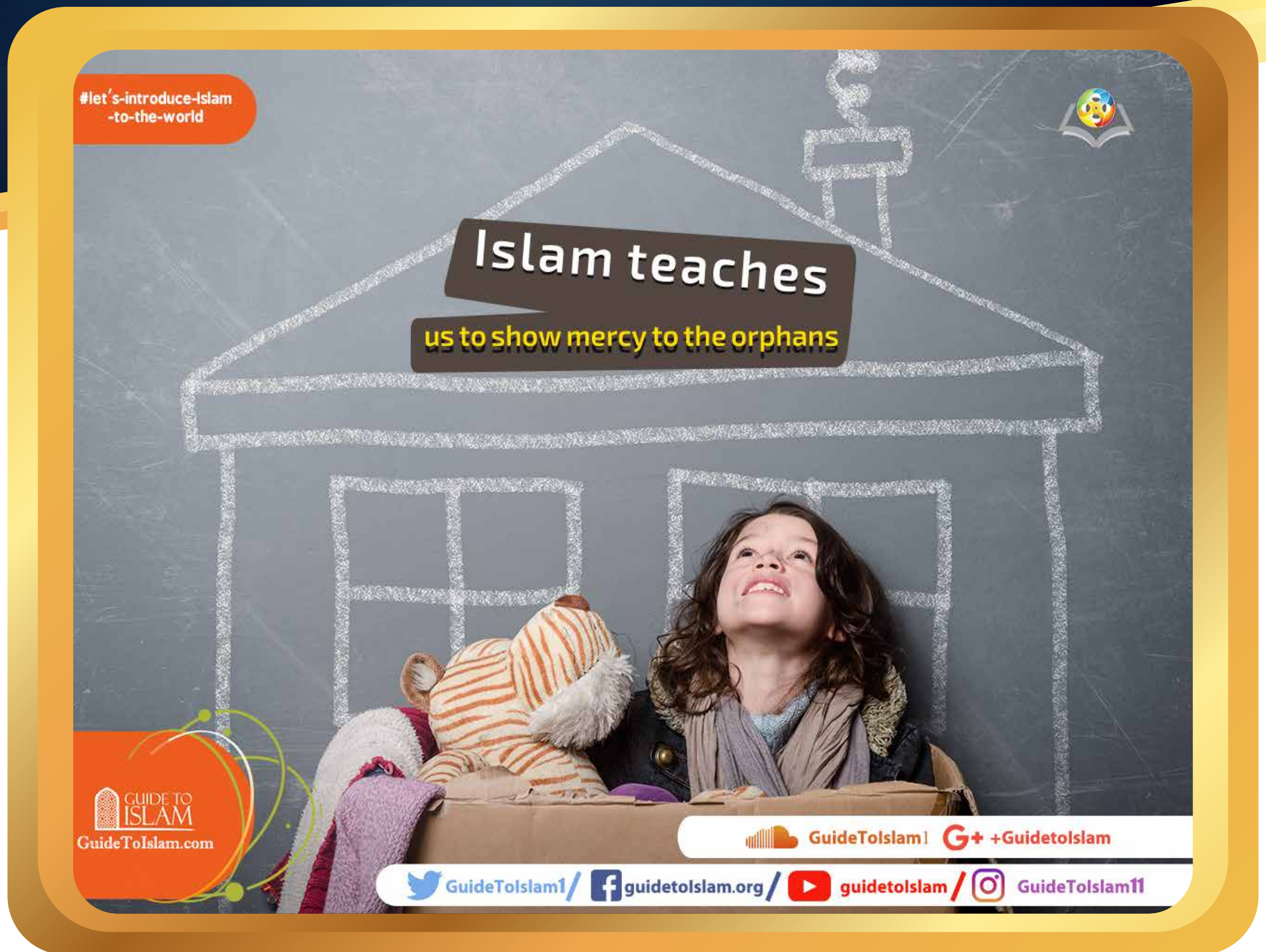




Islam forbids talking about our sins openly

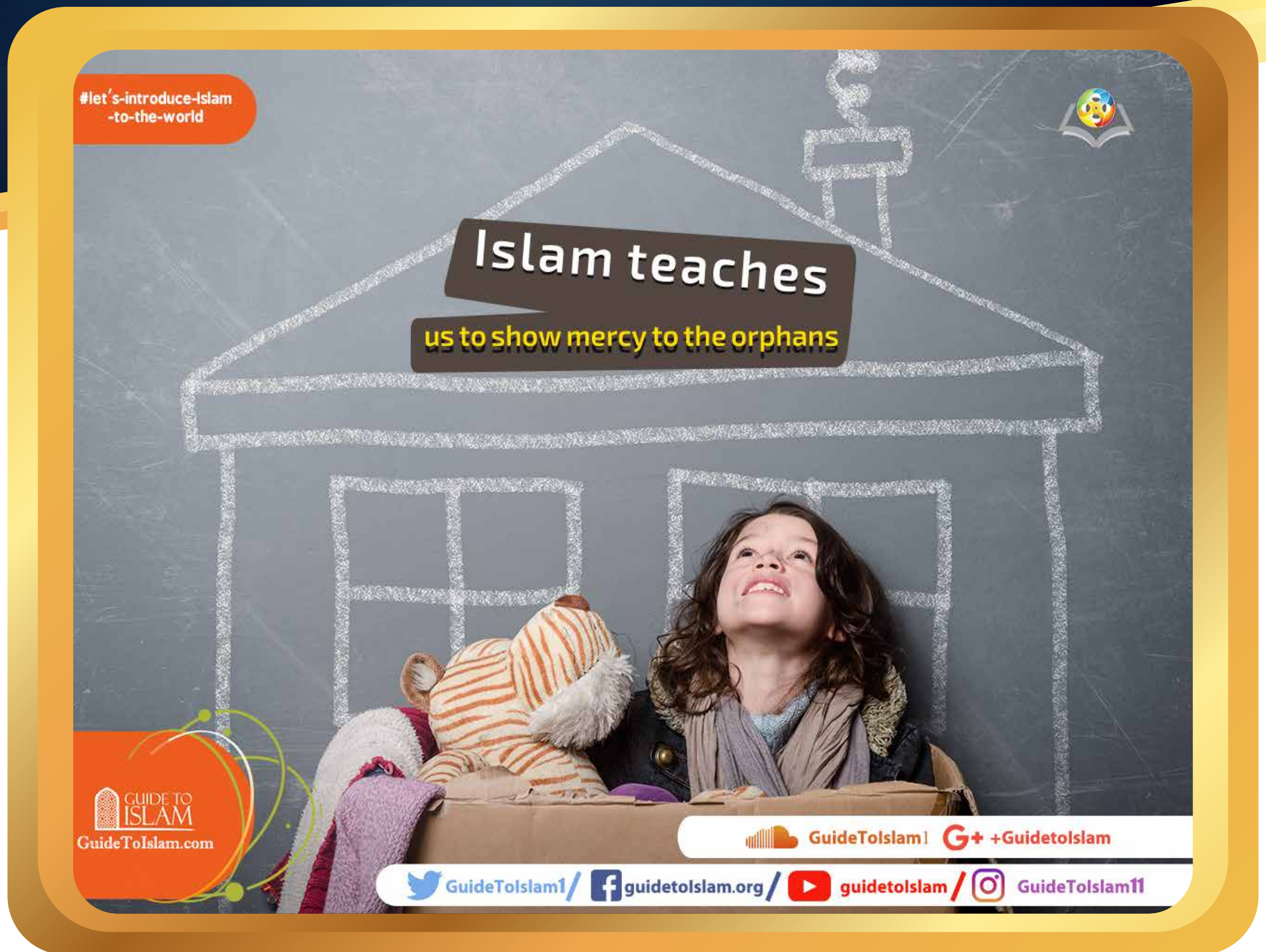




Islam teaches us to show mercy to the orphans

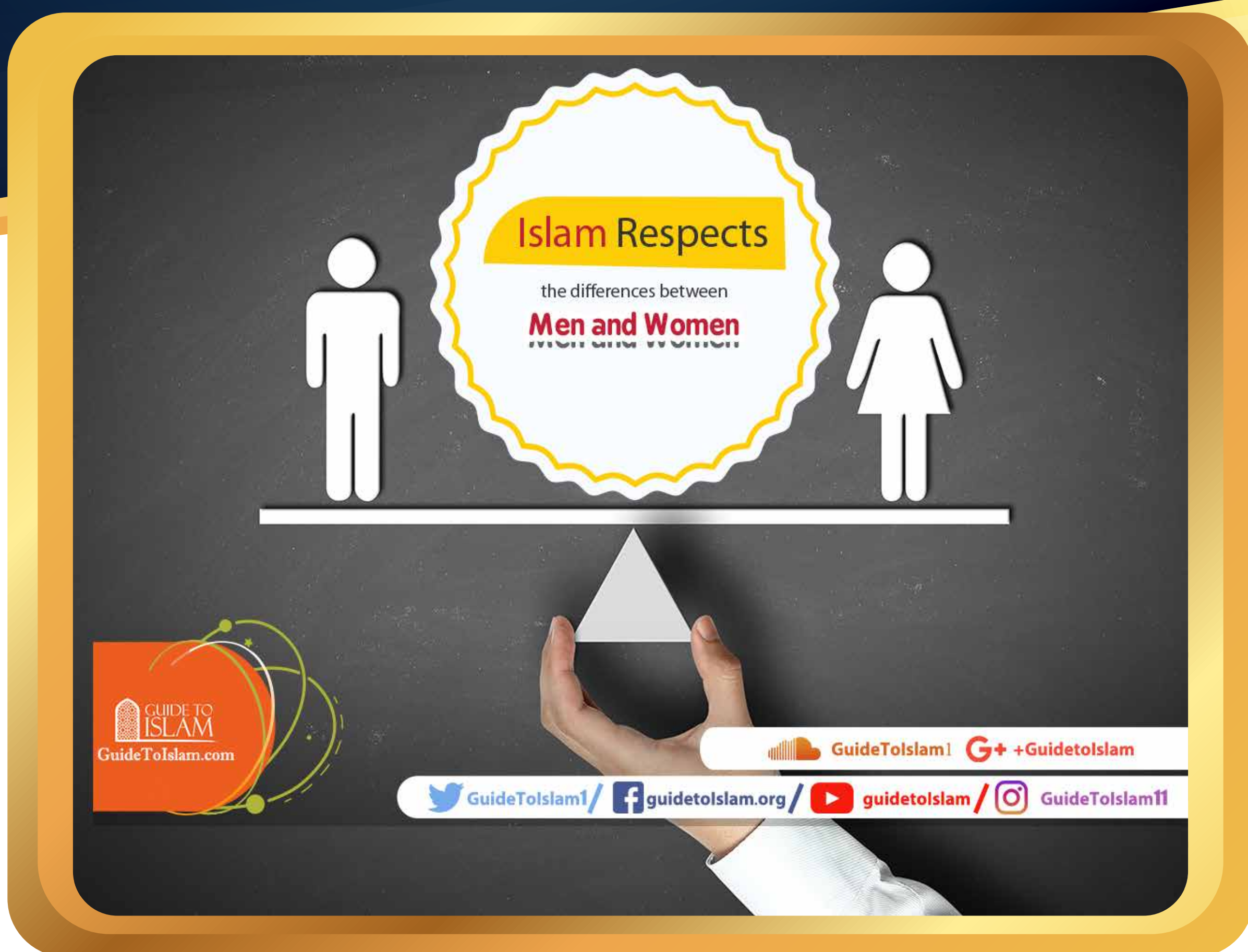




Islam encourages people to enjoy life fully
